

1. Admission criteria for Comprehensive nursing and Midwifery

For the two programs, the cut-off point for first semester common courses will be CGPA- 3.0 and above for males, 2.75 and above for females to be eligible for the competition.

For scholarship candidates from countries like South Sudan and Somalia, a candidate should at least gain $\frac{3}{4}$ th of the grade point for both males and females. This means the cut-off for males is 2.25, while it is 2.1 for females. Advance standing candidates from health facilities should also fulfill the CGPA requirement similar to scholarship students.

The specific criterion and the points given for each are indicated in the table below.

Additional disability and region	5% for each	The 5% added is on the total result

10% will be reserved for female candidates and 5% of the total marks will be added for disability, provided that the disability does not hinder the candidate from joining the program as assessed by professionals from the three specific programs. 5% will also be added for candidates from developing regions (Somali, Benishangul-Gumuz, Gambella and Afar).

All candidates should score 50% or more in the entrance exam prepared by the specific program and a decision will be made by the CMHS academic council in case of lacking candidates with the cut-off point.

N.B

The admission criteria for all programs should be revised every two years.
